San Joaquin Regional Transit District (RTD)

DOWNTOWN TRANSIT CENTER

Open for Customer Service: December 18, 2006

Background

San Joaquin RTD's Downtown Transit Center (DTC) is the transfer point for nearly all of RTD's routes, and serves as the regional public transit hub for residents of Stockton and San Joaquin County going to work, school, appointments, or recreation.

- RTD has 30 Stockton Metro, Intercity, and countywide Hopper routes
- More than 5,000 people use the DTC each weekday on average
- RTD's annual ridership is more than 4 million passenger trips

DTC Location

- Located at 421 E. Weber Avenue, downtown Stockton; occupies the entire city block bordered by Weber Avenue, California, Channel, and Sutter Streets

DTC Passenger Boarding Area

- Opened March 20, 2006, for passenger service
- Dedicated to Jerald L. Hughes, RTD's General Manager 1990-2001
- Two passenger boarding platforms, with full-length canopies, enable passengers to board, deboard, and transfer between buses, similar to a train station
- Four bus lanes have five bus cutouts (stops) per lane, for a total of 20 cutouts

DTC Building

- The building's front elevation retains the façades of three historic buildings
- The center of the building and everything behind the façades is new construction

The DTC building features several amenities that enable RTD to provide its customers with safe, convenient, and accessible services:

- Customer Service Center: on-site customer service staff, system maps and schedule racks, fare purchasing, and route arrival and departure displays
- Passenger Concourse and Lobby area with public restrooms for passengers
- Police Satellite Station: for RTD's contracted Stockton Police Officers

The building's ground floor has additional features that benefit RTD's customers and community:

- Boardroom/Community Meeting Room: the new meeting location for RTD's Board of Directors, this room will also be available as a meeting room for public meetings
- Retail: the storefront on the building's east end features approximately 2,100 square feet of retail space. RTD is in negotiations with a tenant that will provide transit-complementary services (restaurant/food services)
- RTD administrative offices occupy the rest of the building
